



## Plan to Participate in 2010 Water Awareness Month

*Play your part... Live in Prescott “Water Smart”!*

Plant early spring when temperatures are lower. Select and grow native plants. Ask to see and purchase water smart plants at your favorite nursery or home centers. The key to outdoor water management, water early in the day when evaporation is low, water slowly, deeply and less often as soil conditions will allow. Harvest rainwater during the monsoon season. Check your irrigation system monthly for leaks and repair promptly
