

## Community Crime Watch Your Eyes on Crime!

Community Crime Watch is the opportunity for all of us to become involved in making our community safer by recognizing and reporting crime!



## ABOUT COMMUNITY CRIME WATCH

The Prescott Police Department Crime Prevention Section is proud to introduce its latest crime prevention program, Community Crime Watch.

Community Crime Watch is the process of recognizing, observing, and reporting situations appearing to be suspicious. The people reporting suspicious situations are workers, like you, who are out in our community on a daily basis providing an extra set of eyes and ears for us. Examples of community workers include postal workers, electric and gas company workers, and cable installers.

## TYPES OF SITUATIONS



What could be considered a suspicious situation?

A suspicious situation is when something doesn't seem quite right or normal. The situation may make you take a "double-take" or second glance.

Examples of this would include teenagers going over a back fence during school hours, mail or newspapers piling up at a residence, open front doors, family pets that appear to be abandoned in the house or yard, noxious odors, or unknown vehicles parked in your neighborhood.



## THREE SIMPLE STEPS

There are three simple steps to the process of Community Crime Watch:



**RECOGNIZE:** When things appear suspicious or out of the ordinary.



**OBSERVE:** The activity from a safe distance. Do not intervene.



**REPORT:** Any suspicious activity to the Prescott Police Department using either the emergency or non-emergency number as dictated by the situation



## WHO TO CONTACT

### NON-EMERGENCY

We recommend using the non-emergency number if the situation is not immediately threatening to life or property. This would include strange, unoccupied vehicles parked on the street or solicitors going door to door in the area.

### EMERGENCY

We encourage you to use the emergency number if you witness a volatile family fight, house fire or injury auto accident. These situations all involve immediate danger to people and their property.
